

GRID DOWN RESCUE

RULES: IDPA Rules

START POSITION:

Team starts with rifle and pistol loaded to capacity at the 300 yard line of rifle range. Advances slowly to the pits using light discipline and noise discipline. (If no night vision is available, regular weapon lights are allowed)

SCENARIO:

In a grid down situation, two family members are being held by a local gang. This team receives information about those targets and must make decisions as to how to advance, when to shoot, which targets to engage, and which shooters will engage which targets.

PROCEDURE:

Team will slowly advance from the 300 yard line staying together laterally, but on opposite sides of the rifle range, communicating quietly via radio. Team must decide from information received from another team which targets are threats, how close to approach without alerting the targets, when to shoot, and who will shoot which targets. After targets are down, team must approach the area (in the pits) and escort the hostages away. This will be with UNLOADED rifles slung and pointed up or down, and holstered pistols. Hostages may need medical attention.

SCORING: Unlimited

ROUND COUNT: 6

TARGETS: 3

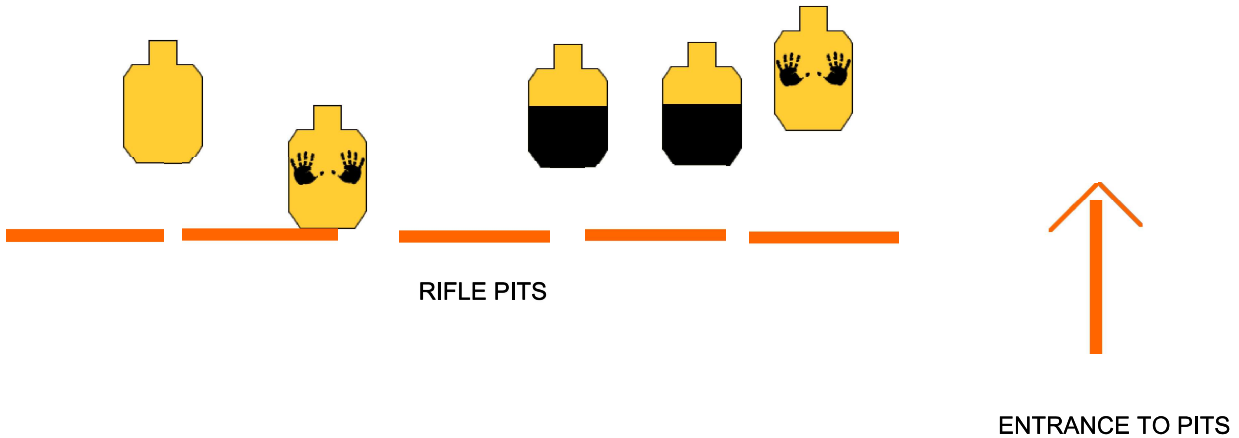
DISTANCE: 50 to 300 YARDS

SCORED HITS: 2 hits on each target with standard points down

PENALTIES: Miss, Hit on Hostages, Noise

CONCEALMENT: Yes

NOTES: Targets are instructed to drop out of sight if noise is heard
